 of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty two I Polly Baxter of
 (Will) Nicholas County of Ohio being ill of body but of sound mind and memory, and
 calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed
 for all men once to die. Do make and ordain this my last Will and
 Testament that is to say principally and first of all I recommend my soul
 into the hands of God who gave it, and as for my body I recommend
 it to the earth to be buried in a Christian and decent manner without
 pomp, at the discretion of Executors and as for such worldly goods as I
 have been the Will of God to bless me with in this life I give devise and
 dispose of the same, in the manner and in form following Viz. Item I give
 to my Brother George Baxter all the land that I am entitled to in my fathers
 Will on the condition of my Brother George Baxters paying all the last
 debts and demands of the Decease or any other person or persons have
 against me Item I give my Horse to my Brother George Baxter also
 two head of cattle but if my Brother George Baxter should never marry
 and die the above land with the house to belong to my sister
 Lucretia Baxter Item I give to my sister Elizabeth Baxter two head
 of sheep Item I give to my sister Lucretia two head of sheep, Item I give
 to sister Elizabeth Baxter my side saddle Item I give to sister Elizabeth
 Baxter my poleaxe and one counterpane Item I give to my sister Lucretia
 Baxter two feather beds five sheets four pillows two coverlets a flowered cou-
 terpane and a corded counterpane and my clothe equally divide between
 Rebecca Knox and sister Elizabeth and Lucretia and my little wheel to
 sister Rebecca Knox and my leghons bonnet to sister Rebecca Knox
 & I will to my Brother William Baxter the money due me from him for
 rent of my grounds and my Bible Item I will to sister Rufina Cooper
 my tea board I constitute and appoint John Hoffstetter my Executor of
 this my last Will and Testament utterly revoking any other will made
 ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and
 testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
