In pursuance of an order of the Nicholas County Court to us directed, we the undersigned commissioners

met at the late dwelling of Richard B. Smith, deceased, on the day of

February 1838 and proceeded to lay off and apportion unto Sarah Smith,

widow and relict of Richard B. Smith, deceased, from Sarah Goodman's

her right of dower in, and to all the lands of which the said Richard B.

Smith died seised and possessed, and to lay off and divide the residue

of said lands amongst all the heirs and legal representatives of said

Richard B. Smith dead as follows, to wit: Said dower lot, bounded

as follows, viz: (See the plat) Beginning at A. a small white oak

on Hiram Norton's line, Thence with said line North 33 poles to

B. a black locust tree & bushy stump corner to said dower,

Thence with another of his lines S. 88 W. 50 poles to C. a large

The Lot no 1 assigned to Leonard Smith (now claimed by William Norton) Beginning at A. a small white oak, the beginning comes to 2 rods down, thence with said lower line & 17 W 52 poles to G a stone comes to said down, thence with another of said lower lines & 17 W 50 poles to H a stone in said lower line, thence & 18 E 53 poles to I a stone in said bottom line, thence with his line North 33 1/2 poles to beginning - containing 18 acres 1 Rood & 26 poles of land.

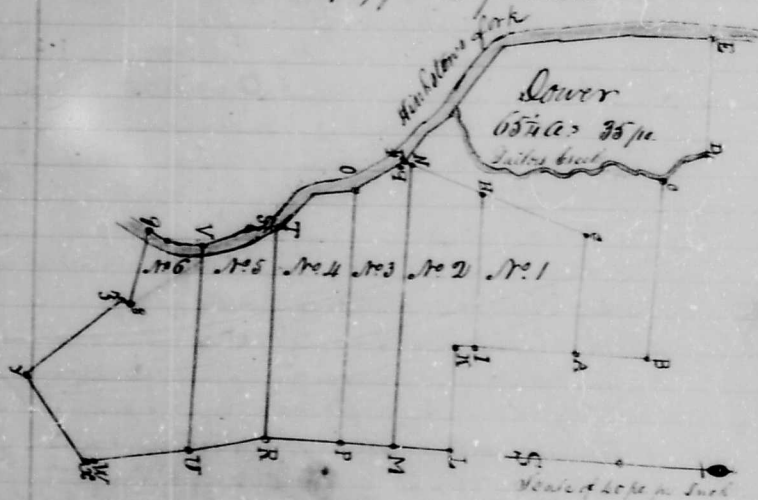
The lot no 2 assigned to Elizabeth Smith one of the heirs of said Richard B. Smith deceased Beg at J a stone, E. corner to lot no 1. Thence South 8 poles to K a stone, one pole North of a sugar tree marked as a corner, also comes to L a stone, thence with another of his lines East 18 poles to L a stone another of his corners and in a line of George Riddle, thence with 20 Riddle line South 26 poles to M a stone in 1st line. Thence West 12 poles to N a stone in said lower line, thence with 20 lower line & 19 E 40 poles to H. M. comes to lot no 1. Thence with a line of 20 lot & 18 E 53 poles to the beginning, containing 23 acres 3 Roods and 36 poles.

The lot no 3 assigned to Mary Ann Smith one of the heirs of Richard B. Smith deceased Beg at M a stone South East corner to lot no 2 in said George Riddle line. Thence with his line South 24 poles to P a stone in said Riddle line, thence West 18 poles to O a stone on the S. E. bank of Hinkston, thence down Hinkston & 2 1/2 W 20 to Q a stone, thence & 19 E 3 poles to F corner to 1st down, thence with said lower line & 17 E 3 poles to N a stone S. W. corner to lot no 2. Thence with a line of said lot East 12 poles to the beginning containing 18 acres and 16 poles of land.

The lot no 4 assigned to Letitia Smith now owned by said William Norton Beginning at P. S. corner of lot no 3 on 1st Riddle line, thence with 1st line South 34 poles to R a Hickory corner of 20 Riddle, thence West 78 poles to S a stone on the bank of Hinkston in 1st Riddle patent line, thence with 1st line North 2 poles to T a sugar tree, thence down Hinkston on the S. W. bank of said Hinkston, thence down 1st Hinkston & 2 1/2 W 15 3/4 poles, thence & 34 W 8 poles, thence North crossing Hinkston 13 poles to S. South West corner to lot no 4. Thence with the line of said lot East 40 poles to the beginning, containing 21 acres & 34 poles. The lot no 6 assigned to William Smith another of the heirs of said Richard B. Smith deceased, now owned by said William Norton - Beginning at U the South East corner to lot no 5, with the line of the squares, thence with his line South 10 E 22 1/4 poles to W a small blue ash stump on said Harris line, thence with said line South 24 poles to X a locust stump, corner to C Parkers land, thence with his line & 11 W 2 1/4 poles to Y a sugar tree, corner to 2nd Parkers, thence with another of his lines & 11 W 34 poles to Z a stone, corner to said Parkers & George Riddle, thence with a line of said Riddle & 30 E 3 1/2 poles to figure 8 a box elder stump, corner to said Riddle, thence with his line & Tailors patent line & 30 W 33 poles crossing Hinkston to figure 9 a stone on the South bank thereof, thence with the meanders of said Hinkston & 25 E 7 1/2 poles, thence & 7 E 16 1/2 poles to V a stone on the South West bank of said Hinkston S. W. corner to lot no 5. Thence with said line East 92 poles to the beginning, containing 26 acres 1 Rood & 27 poles of land.
