R. By the said J. M. Squires appraisers appointed by the County Court
of Nicholas, to appraise the Negroes, and other personal property
also, now belonging to the estate of Robert Lykes, deceased, and to allot it
to him in law, viz. by the widow of said deceased, her dower, met at the house
of the deceased on Saturday the 25th 1830 - and made the annexed
Inventory of the Negroes and other property, and affixed to it.

Dykes, two Negroes, tint, Macke, a negro man, aged 22 years old
 valued at five hundred dollars, and Judith, a negro girl aged 17
 years, valued at three hundred dollars, amounting to eight hundred
 and fifty dollars, which exceeds her dower interest by twenty
 five dollars, which exceeds the accounts to the estate for
 the whole value of the Negroes amounted to two thousand four
 hundred and seventy five dollars - eight hundred and twenty five
 dollars more than her dower interest.

In the name of God Amen; I Jesse Baskett of the
 Nicholas County of a Nicholas and State of Kentucky, being of sound and
 disposing memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of life and
 certainty of death, do therefore make and ordain this my last Will
 and Testament in manner and form following, to wit, I give
 my soul to God, who gave it, and my body to be buried at the discretion
 of my friends, and as to my estate, my Will is that my last debts be
 paid out of my personal estate, if there should be sufficient for that
 purpose, if not, then the balance to be paid out of my slaves; 2^d I give
 to my sons Jesse and my son Robert, three children, my man, Isaac,
 after my decease to be sold and money equally divided between Jesse &
 Robert, three children 3^d I will the balance of my negroes, Tom, Jacob and
 Barriette, to my wife, after my death, during her natural life, and then to
 be equally divided between my first wife's children, to wit, Melly, Martin,
 James, Polly, Jesse and Robert, children, John excepted in this 3^d clause, to wit.
 I will and bequeath to my wife Charlotte, the land and farms on which
 I now live, during her natural life, and at her death to be divided
 among my children by my last wife, as follows. To my son Henry (John
 my daughter, Katherine, Elizabeth, Frances, Nancy, William, Susan, Kate, Mary
 Charlotte, Louise, George, to be equally divided, or sold and the proceeds equally
 divided among the above named children. Be my wish after my death
 a is paid, to Will my sons Henry and William, fifty dollars each, out of
 my personal property, if there should be as much left, the balance of my
 personal property if any, I leave to my wife during her life, and at her
 death to be equally divided amongst all my children, by both wives, as to
 my son John I have provided for him a farm heretofore, and lastly, I constitute
 and appoint my friends, John Conway and Robert McNamee, Executors
 of this my last Will and Testament, revoking all others. In test
