also all my just debts to be paid by Alexander
Whitaker my well beloved brother unto whom I
also do will and bequeath as follows and more
bridle and saddle and also my wearing clothes
the balance being owed to Saml Parker. Also
I do appoint Alexander Whitaker my well beloved
Brother Executor of this my last will and testament
And in full testimony of this being my last will
and testament I do sign my hand and seal
this the 3 of September in the year of our Lord
