1803. I Daniel Holt, of the State of Kentucky and County
of Ohio, being very sick and weak in body, but of Perfect
mind and memory, (Thanks be given unto God for the
same) and Calling to mind the mortality of my body
and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to
die. Do make and ordain this my last will and
Testament, (That is to say,) Principally and
first of all, I give and recommend my soul unto the
hands of God that gave all, and for my body, I
recommend it to the Earth to be buried with Chris-
tian like and decent Manner at the discretion
of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the
General Resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty Power of God. and as
touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath
Pleased God to bless me with, in this life, I give
devise and dispose of the same in Manner fol-
-lowing. That is to say, In the first place that
my lawfull debts, and funeral Charges to be paid
out of my Estate, In the Second place I likewise
constitute make and ordain Martin Vannada
of the State of Kentucky and County of Ohio my son
and sole Executor, of this my last will and
Testament. I likewise give and bequeath unto
my black Woman Mary her freedom During
life. after my Decease I likewise author

ise my Executor, to make Sale of all my pro-
perty to the best advantage and the amount of
the same to be put to use at Lawfull Interest
I likewise, unto my Mulatto boy Charles his
freedom, at the age of twenty one years, and
also to my Mulatto boy Capt^t William Dean
and the said Boys to be brought up at the dis-
cretion of my Executor till they are of the age
of seven years. Then they are to have a com-
mon Education and then to be put to trades
till the age of 21 years. and further for the
true meaning and Intent, of this my last
Will and Testament, is the aforesaid Black
Woman Mary, and the aforesaid named Mulatto
Boys. I to have the interest, or use of the
amount of my Estate, to be equally divided
amongst them, and to them heirs forever, That
is to say in Case of old age or infirmity.
And I do utterly disallow, revoke and disan-
nule all and every other former Testaments
Wills and Legacies, Bequests and Executors,
by me in any ways before this time, nam-
ed, Willed and Bequeathed, Ratifying & Con-
firming this and no other to be my last
will and Testament. In Witness

Item 7th giving to my said wife in her lifetime the liberty of giving to the first Child that my Daughter Margaret should, may have, that lives to want it, any property she may think proper not exceeding one third of the moveable Estate she may be possess^r of at that time and Lastly I do appoint my friend Stephen Cleaver to Execute this my Last will and Testament as Witness my hand and Seal. this 16th day of July 1800
