In the Name of God I John Tate of Ohio County & State of Kentucky being sick and weak in Body but in usual soundness of mind & memory and recollecting that it is appointed for all men once to die do constitute make ordain and appoint this to be my last will and Testament I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Jennet Tate all and singular my Estate both real and personal to be for her only use and behoof to buy sell give grant and do with the same as she may think best for and during her natural life and after her decease my wife and desires is that what ever there is then of said Estate that it be equally divided amongst all my Children the first my wife and I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 22nd day of February 1820
