this my last will and Testament. In

Eighth day of November One thousand Eight
hundred and twelve

In the name of God Amen. Know all men by these
Presence that I Eli Bralt of the County of Ohio
and State of Kentucky being weak in Body but
Sound in mind do constitute and ordain this my
last will and Testament in the manner and form
following (To wit) It is my will and desire that all
Just Debts that I am owing shall be paid; It is
my further will and desire that my wife Nancy
shall have the following debts that are owing me
in the State of Maryland by Thos and Bralt and
the debt due by William Roberts and my sons
William Bralt which I suppose to be two hundred
dollars or perhaps upwards and one hundred dollars
due by Charles Weatherington all of which I have
as above stated I leave to my said wife for the purpose
of her buying a Negro if she thinks proper to be her
property during her widowhood but if she should
marry then it is to descend to my Children and
to be Equally divided amongst them, it is further
my will and desire that all my personal property
shall be Equally divided amongst my Children
after my said wife has first had one third part
of it laid off to her by two or three Steddy and
Men the remainder to be Equally divided by said men
amongst my Children; It is further my will and
desire that the tract of land whereon I now live
shall be Equally divided amongst my four
Children and should it appear that the title
to said land cannot be got then in that case

the money that I have paid for said land I wish to be laid and that land to be divided as above directed also the tract of land of one hundred acres I hold in the Indiana Territory I wish and direct it to be Equally divided between my four Children both tracts to be divided by two or three disinterested men and my said Children to cast lots for choice also it is my will that the place I hold on Pop Creek if it can be ever got shall be equally divided amongst my four Children to be divided in the same manner that I have directed in the division of my other lands further it is my will that if there should be any other debt or property of mine not named in this will that it shall be Equally divided amongst my said Children. it is further my will and I do hereby appoint my Son William my Executor and my wife my Executrix of this my last will with full power and authority to carry into Effect all the provisions contained in my said will ratifying and confirming and revoking all former wills and declaring this my last will and testament Signed and sealed in the presence of us this 15th day of February 1814
