the said Negroes they are to be hired out till
free and the money arising therefrom to be
applied as follows Viz after my funeral charges
is paid and all my Just Debts I give and
Bequeath to my son Richard and Solor having
received his part I then give and bequeath to my son
The sum five Dollars in full of all my Real
and personal Estate I give and Bequeath
to Lepe Pugh and Solor of all my real and

personal Estate I give and Bequeath unto my son ^{William} Solor
he having received part of my Estate I give and bequeath
to my son Simon and Solor he having received part of
my Estate I give and bequeath unto my son in law Samuel
Brown and Solor he having received part of my Estate
I give and bequeath unto my son in law Samuel Harph
Twenty dollars in full of all my real and personal Estate
I will and bequeath unto my son Septimus one Solor
he having received part of my Estate I also will that
an Condition that my son Richard Tayla Call on my
Executor, for to discharge a certain Bond giving Thelene
for forty five pound which I gave him to stand in Security
for said Septimus an Condition he shall left a Bond
of Septimuses in the hands of a certain Caleb Seel in
Virginia if said Septimus do not discharge it that he
pay it without interest thereon to my Estate I also
ordain and decree that my plantation on which I now
live with all my Stock of every kind with all my
moveable furniture household and farming utensils and also
my property with all my out standing Debts be ^{to be} disposed
disposed of at the Discretion of my Executor Either at
Public or private Sale as they may deem it best in Law
I do not not sell it in my lifetime - And after
the payment of my lawfull and Just Debts with
in a few days already mentioned and demanded
the Balance what ever may remain to be divided
between my four Children viz Stephen Solor
Joseph and Joan Pughman in manner and form

knowing the uncertainty of life do think proper to ordain
& publish this my last will & Testament and do give &
bequeath my Estate in the following manner - I wish
I wish all my real and personal Estate of every description
to be vested in my two Executors hereafter named to be sold
or disposed of in any manner or any part either real or personal
as which they may think proper for the discharge of my
debts and in case they sell any of the real Estate my will
is to vest them with the power of conveying the same to the
purchaser or purchasers
and it is my will that during my said negro woman
Shoulet serves as a slave for seven years from my decease &
for that time to be disposed of as my Executors think proper
but the expiration of the seven years I will and give to
her her freedom. I will and bequeath to each of my
Sons one hundred Dollars a piece & then on a division of my
Estate among my children my sons each to have equal
shares with my daughters exclusive of the one hundred
Dollars a piece aforesaid
Likewise I do nominate & appoint my Brother Richd.
Taylor and my Son John A Taylor Executors of this my
last will to dispose of my estate as aforesaid. It is not my intention
to vest my estate in the Executors only to discharge the
debts & settle the same and in case they should disa-
gree in any particular Cause on point I give them
the power of Choosing and umpire in which
a majority of the three shall rule Signed Sealed
& Published by me as my last will & Testament
this 10th day of November 1821 -
