the money that I have paid for said land I wish to be paid and that land to be divided as above directed also the tract of land of one hundred acres I hold in the Indian's history I wish and direct it to be Equally divided between my four Children both tracts to be divided by two or three disinterested men and my said Children to cast lots for choice also it is my will that the place where on Pop Creek if it can be we get shall be equally divided amongst my four Children to be divided in the same manner that I have directed in the division of my other lands further it is my will that if there should be any other debts or property of mine not named in this will that it shall be equally divided amongst my said Children. it is further my will and I do hereby appoint my Son William my Executor and my wife my Executrix of this my last will with full power and authority to carry into Effect all the provisions contained in my said will ratifying and confirming and revoking all former wills and declaring this my last will and testament Signed and sealed in the presence of us this 15th day of February 1814
