I John Field of Ohio County, Kentucky ^{and State of}
do make this my last Will and Testament
as followeth:

Impremis I give to my son William
Field, one hundred and fifty acres of Land out of
the tract whereon I now live and West Corner then
of bounding on Bear Field and Ferguson John
and his heirs forever.

Item, I give unto George Ashby Twenty five
acres of Land, part of the same tract, including
the Plantation on which he lives to him and his
heirs forever. And desire the residue of said
Tract, (being seven hundred and fifty acres) to be
equally divided between Elizabeth Field, Han-
nah Field, Nancy Field, Becharias Field,
James Field and Aquela Field to them and their
heirs forever. It is further my desire that my
beloved wife Sally Field should enjoy Peace-
able Possession of the Mansion house and farm
threts belonging as her dower, and at her death
that my son Aquela Field and his heirs, enjoy
it forever thereafter, it is also my desire, that on
a division of the Land as before mentioned, that
each lot be valued by two or more disinter-
ested men without regard to Improvements, and
that they be made Equal by one paying to
the other and should any one Loose his or

her Part, by Prior or better Claims - that in that
case, those holding Land should pay to those that
might be so unfortunate, as to Loose, their full pro-
portion of what, may be safe, and Clear of any
other Better Claim, In the next place I give
To my son William Field a young mare Colt
known by the name of the glass Eyed Colt

Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth Field
one Feather Bed and Furniture, to her and her
heirs forever.

It is my earnest desire my negro woman
Lyda should be free at the death of my wife Sal-
ly, and that Tom her son should Live his mis-
tress, until he arrives at the age of thirty
years, If she should live so long - but should
she depart this life before he arrives to that
Period, it is my wish and desire that he the
said Tom Live my son William Field
untill he is thirty years of age, aforesaid and
no longer - It is further my desire that
should Lyda have any Children during
her servitude that they, should be sold at the
death of my wife, as bond Servants untill
they are thirty years of age and no longer &
the money equally divided between my
Children, and that all the residue of

my Estate, except as above mentioned be Equally divided amongst my above named Children as they marry & become of age. to them and their heirs forever.

And Lastly I nominate and appoint my trustee friend Ben^y Field my whole & sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament
