of the County of Ohio and State of Kentucky have thought
proper to make my will being in perfect strength of
Mind, and memory well knowing that all men
was born to die, I therefore give my soul to Al-
mighty God beseeching him by and through the
Merits of Jesus Christ my dear redeemer, to pardon
all my sins, and offences, against his divine Majes-
ty likewise I give my body to be decently buried
in a Christianlike manner, and as for my worldly
Estate, I hath pleased God to bestow on me, I do
give as follows (to wit) Item 1st. It is my will
that all my lawful debts be first paid, out of my
moveable Estate, Item 2nd. I give and bequeath
unto my dear and beloved wife Elizabeth Sprung-
ston, all the residue of my Estate both real and
Personal, to have hold and possess the same, du-
ring her lifetime for her support, and my said
Wife has full liberty, to better sell or change,
any of the immoveable property as she thinks proper
in her lifetime for her own good. Item 3rd. After
the death of my beloved Wife, my will is that
the property shall be divided, as follows (to wit)
Item 4th. I give and bequeath unto my son Wil-
liam Sprungston one dollar, ^{likewise} also to my son in law
John Shields, one Dollar, as I consider they both
have had their full portions before — Item
5th. I give unto my Daughter Linty

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Springston, thirteen pounds, Six Shillings out of my moveable Estate, if so much left, as I should be that much behind, in receiving - Item 6th I then wish the balance of the moveable property with land I dec. Beased of to be equally divided between my son Abraham and my Daughter Linty. —

Item 7th giving to my said wife in her lifetime the liberty of giving to the first Child that my Daughter Margaret should, may have, that lives to want it, any property she may think proper not exceeding one third of the moveable Estate she may be possess^r of at that time and Lastly I do appoint my friend Stephen Cleaver to Execute this my Last will and Testament as Witness my hand and Seal. this 16th day of July 1800
