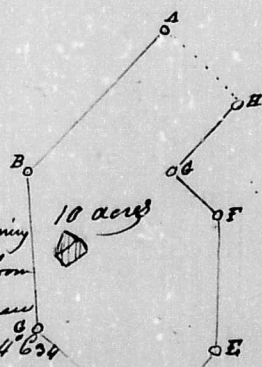

Thomas Monks Esq<sup>r</sup> returned into Court a plat and certificate of a survey made by the county Surveyor of certain bounds attached the Goal, and the present prison bounds being thought by the Court inconvenient orders that the said Survey be recorded in place thereof, & that the same be recorded as follows

(to wit)

"Survey by order of the Mississippi the County Court of this Court under the Direction of the Sheriff 10 acres of Land for the prison and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a stake standing 12 p<sup>s</sup> due west from the west corner of Robert Monks's new house, running thence south 44° 6' 24" p<sup>s</sup> to the south corner of Lot No 47 & 48 now in the possession of M<sup>r</sup> Fitzhugh & Monks

then east 28 p<sup>s</sup> to the south side of the street near the west corner of the Stray pen thence North 44° 6' 24" p<sup>s</sup> to a stake in the south side of said street and in the street then with said last mentioned street and back of Lot No 65 & 66 now in the
