In The Name of Good Amos - Whereas I William White
Jones Belt being in a very low state of health and
convinced of the certainty of Death. But being of sound
mind and memory thanks be to God for his mercies do
make this my last will and Testament -
I do give and bequeath to my unfortunate brother
Henry Ludlow Belt all my property of a family of Negroes
willed to me by my Grand Mother Sarah Jones of Maryland
to be subject to the Control and management of my
Father Carlton Belt until he the above named Henry
Belt shall arrive at full age, and further I give
all my proportion of the Estate coming to me from the
Death of my uncle Edward Jones who died at Orleans
and the above Henry Belt after the Expenses of my
Burying is paid with the Doctors account and twenty
dollars to my Cousin Charlotte Belt wife of Higginson
Belt for her kind attention to me during my illness
the whole of which is to be managed by my Father
Carlton Belt and subject to his Control - further
the debts due me in Davies County my wife is for
him to collect and pay my Charges that are or
may be accumulated by my present sickness
and lastly I will and bequeath to my relation
Higginson Belt my silver watch to do as he pleases
with - In witness whereof I do hereby acknowledge
this my last will and Testament signed with my
own hand this thirteenth of September 1832 -
