Following manner that is to say I Give and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Barrett all my Real and personal Estate during her natural life time, in a state of widow hood in case of my said wife's marriage after my death. She is to retain so much of said Estate only as the law allows Widows in such cases, after the death of my said wife Elizabeth the whole of the real and personal Estate to be disposed of, and Equally divided between my Children Richard W. Barrett Sally Parr Joshua P. Barrett William Barrett Ignatius Barrett Matilda Barrett Thomas Jefferson Barrett and James B. Barrett as witness my hand and seal, this 16th day of January 1819.
