Seventh the balance of my estate to be equally divided amongst my children should any or either of them die destitute of heirs in that case their share or shares to fall into the residue of my estate. I Appoint my wife Polly Conard Peter Conard and John Elliott executor of this my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this seventh day of July One thousand Eight Hundred and fifteen Signed sealed and published by the said Byram Conard to be his testament and last will in the presence of us

In the name of God amen I William Grant of Bullitt County & State of Kentucky being weak of body but of sound mind & memory do make Constitute & appoint this my last will & Testament in form & manner following To wit after my Funeral Expence & my just Debts are paid my Desire is that the remains of my Est be divided as follows - I Give & bequeath to the Children of my son William Grant To wit William Grant John Grant Libbellow Grant Whitted Grant Eliza Grant and Horst Whitted and all others that he may have in a lawfull way One third part of all my negroes and other moveable property Except what may be hereafter mentioned and my Desire is that the negro boy Stephen which William Grant had in possession & sold may be brought in as one of the number that may fall to his Children in the Division of my negroes - The said William Grant having received his full part of land in Virginia also household furniture - I Give & bequeath to the Children of my son Daniel Grant To wit Eliza Grant Daniel Grant Just and all others which he may have in a lawfull way. One Other Third part of all my negroes & other moveable property Except what may be hereafter mentioned to them & their heirs forever - and my Desire is that the negro man Ben which the said Daniel Grant has now in possession be brought in as one of the number of Negroes falling to his Children - the said Daniel Grant having received his full

proportion of land & furniture in Virginia which he
 Sold - Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Moley W
 Prum if living at the time of the division of my Est.
 my watch & if she should be dead before that time
 my desire is that my watch be given up to my grandson
 William Grant son of William. the said M W Prum
 being fully provided for before Item I give & bequeath
 to my two Grand sons William Grant and Posey D
 Grant son of Posey D Grant decd. the tract of land
 which I bought of Benja Cox lying in Ohio County,
 State of Kentucky to be equally divided between a
 time hereafter appointed there is one pay ment yet
 due said Cox for said land of \$800 to be paid
 out of my Est. On the first day of January 1820
 and my desire is that the money arising from the
 hire of the negroes Jovit George and Emily be
 applyed to that use also the money arising from
 the Sale of the present crop of corn and
 other little property and if that is not sufficient
 and the balance cannot be made in time my
 desire is that as many of my negroes be hired
 out as will make the payment to said Cox before
 a Division taken place - Also I give & bequeath to my
 Grand Children - Ann Grant Hannah P. Grant
 William Grant & Posey D Grant one other
 third part of all my negroes and other moveable
 property all which I give to them & their heirs for
 ever and my desire further is that the widow
 Elizabeth Grant be removed to said plantation
 in Ohio County by my waggon & team - and my
 desire further is that the Widow Elizabeth

Grant have full possession of the said tract of land
 bought of Cox with all houses &c and to till and
 make use of the land as she may see cause for the raising
 & schooling of her children or during her natural
 life or widowhood but if she should see cause
 to marry then in that case my desire is that the
 negroes falling to them be kept on the said land to work
 it & the profits arising from the produce of said land be
 applyed to the use & benefit of the children untill
 the youngest as before mentioned come to age and my
 desire further is that the Widow Elizabeth Grant
 take possession of her childrens part of the negroes
 & use them for the support of herself and children
 during her life or widowhood but if she should
 marry the negroes to remain on the land as
 before mentioned - and my desire further is that
 Elizabeth Grant Widow of Posey D Grant receive
 out of my present crop of corn thirty Barrels
 also as much fodder as serves her stock also five
 hundred weight of Pork which is now in pickle
 Item I give and bequeath to Elizabeth Grant wid
 dow of Posey D Grant decd and her children
 One bay Horse called the Copper horse - also I give
 to the said Elizabeth Grant and her children
 One fine Cow now with calf and one fine heifer
 for her use & her childrens and the increase of
 said Cows to be divided among her present children
 at her death and as for household furniture
 I have very little except one bed and fur
 niture which I give & bequeath to my

Grandson William Grant Son of Pacey to him this
 him forever and lastly there being 400 acres of land
 in the tract of land purchased of Benjamin Cox
 my Son Daniel Grant agreeing to take one hundred
 & fifty acres of it & to pay the last payment to sd
 Cox which will become due on the first
 day of January 1821 at which time the said
 Cox is bound to make a Warranty Deed for said
 land now my desire is that my Executors lay
 off to said Daniel Grant one hundred and fifty
 acres of said land so as to take in the small
 tenement which the said Grant intends to
 live & so to be laid off as to extend to the aught
 line to make the quantity and my desire
 is that when the sd. I Grant shall make
 the last payment to said Cox that my Executors
 make to him or his heirs a good Deed for said land
 after which will be left to William Grant and
 Pacey & Grant Sons of Pacey & Grant decd. Two
 hundred & fifty acres with the houses &c to be
 disposed of as before mentioned - And my desire
 further is that said Lucy come not into a
 division but shall have the privilege to go &
 live with either of the Children she may think
 proper also I am to be appraised but kept out of
 the Division until the Division be made
 and then what ever of my heirs she may
 think proper to live with shall pay to the other
 two - Two thirds of her value as appraised
