1st I give and bequeath to William Newton two In Lts known on the plan of the Town of Hartford by No (77 & 78) seventy seven and seventy eight.

2^d I give to John Field also two In Lts known as aforesaid by No (95 & 96) ninety five and ninety six

3^d It is my will and I do hereby give and bequeath unto my Negro Woman Milly and her eight children David, Julia, Warren, Belia, Fanny, Anna, Felix, Aliso, and Urias, their Freedom to act and do for themselves to be free they and their children forever.

4th I give to a Milly one out lot known as aforesaid by No. 13, thirteen; to Urias, out lot No. 14, fourteen; to Alfred out lot No. 15, fifteen; to Julia out lot No. 16, sixteen; to Belia out lot No. 17, seventeen; to Warren, out lot No. 18, ten; to Felix, out lot No. 9, nine; to Fanny, out lot No. 18, eighteen; to Anna out lot No. 19, nineteen;

5th I also give to Milly sixty dollars in money to purchase a Horse if she needs one if not to do with it as she may think proper also I give to her one hundred bushels of Corn -
6th My will is that at the death of Milly the lot I have here given her should descend and belong to Alfred and Urias or their heirs.

7th I further give to my two negro Men, Milly, all my household & kitchen furniture of every description -

8th I give to Martin Hudson one hundred dollars -

9th I give and bequeath all my other Estate, after payment of my just debts, unto my brother Urias to be equally divided among them and those which are now deceased or any may be at my death I wish their heirs to receive the part or share which the deceased brother or sister would be entitled to under this will were they living -

10th I nominate and appoint William Newton and John Field my Executors of this my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have here set my hand and Seal and do publish this as my last will the 11th day of July 1826

To, wit, It is my will and desire that William and Julia should be free and completely emancipated together with all of my Slaves or servants at my death - It is my will and desire that my Estate both personal and real be sold to discharge my debts if necessary in order that my said Slaves may be set free and I hereby authorize and direct my said Executors or either of them that may qualify to sell my land and real Estate and convey the same to the purchaser if he or they deem it necessary for the payment of my debts and the security of the Freedom of any said Slaves -
