 First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Lucy Haynes and her heirs all the real and personal property that she had at the time of our Marriage also the farm that we have purchased for that we know live on
 I do also give and bequeath unto my own children all the property that I had at the time of my last Marriage to be equally divided between them after paying all my just debts
 And I do hereby constitute and appoint Charles Knight of the aforesaid County and State to be my sole Administrator of this my last will and Testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty-eighth day of April 1836.

 Secondly I give and bequeath unto my two beloved daughters Sarah Chapman and Hannah Chapman their heirs and assigns forever all the residue of my personal property except the aforesaid plantation utensils Thirdly I give to my wife and bequeath to my two daughters Leah Hipsley and Eliza Benton one shilling each having formerly given them what I thought myself able and lastly I do appoint my beloved wife Francis Chapman together with her my Executors and Joshua Chapman together with her my Executor of this my last will and Testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 20th day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight Hundred and seven Signed sealed published and pronounced by the above Joshua Chapman named Testator as his last will and Testament in the presence of us who have subscribed our names as witnesses
