 Kentucky do make Ordain and Constitute this my last will and
 testament first I desire that all my Just debts and funeral
 expenses be paid with as little delay as consistent pulling my attention
 to no unnecessary cost or trouble - but should any debts come against
 me that my Executor believes to be unjust I desire that he shall
 resist it by all legal means - Secondly after the payment or payment
 of all my debts I devise to my wife Lucy T. Megea all my
 Estate that shall remain of every description real personal and
 mixed to her and her her heirs forever - Thirdly I Constitute
 my friend Larkin Wall Executor of this my last will and
 testament vesting him with full power to settle & compromise
 any dispute that may arise relative to any of my business
 in any way he may deem most advisable and do request
 that he be permitted to qualify without giving Security - In
 testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand this

State of Kentucky Vol. 1. A County Court held for Ohio
 County at the Court house in Hartford on Monday the 3rd day
 of July 1843 This last will and testament of Edward
 T. Megea was Exhibited in Court and proved by the oath
 of John W. Crow a Subscribing Witness thereto the said Crow
 being questioned as to the hand writing of John H. Henry the
 other Subscribing Witness says that he is acquainted with the hand
 writing of said Henry and that his Signature as annexed to
 said Will is genuine whereupon said will is ordered to be recorded
 and thereupon Larkin Wall the Executor named in said will
 having taken the oath required by law executed bond in the sum
 of \$500 - and thereupon as the law directs a Certificate of probate
 is granted him in due form again at a County Court held for
 said County at the Court house in Hartford on Monday
 the 6th day of November 1843 This will was again Exhibited
 in Court by the Clerk and fully proven by the oath of John
 H. Henry the other Subscribing witness thereto and ordered
 to be recorded which is done
