

The last will and Testament of Mary Elizabeth Thrasher in the name of God Amen I Mary Elizabeth Thrasher of Ohio County State of Kentucky do being of sound mind and disposing memory do make ordain and Establish this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows to wit viz

1st I desire to be decently buried by my legates here after named

2nd I Give and bequeath to my Brother Thomas Blacklock and Edward Blacklock all my property of every description whatever to be Equally divided between them & in case they cannot agree upon the division of any of my property I hereby nominate my friend James Fitzhugh to divide the same between them which division shall be considered binding also five Hundred and fifty dollars in the hands of Andrew Watkins

3rd It is my desire that my Brothers Thomas and Edward pay to my three nephews the Son of my deceased sister Charity Dimer one Hundred dollars a piece

4th I hereby appoint my Brother Thomas Blacklock and Edward Blacklock my Executors and it is my request that they shall not be compelled to Give any security as such 10th June 1839

Barritt another subscribing witness thereto and ordered to be recorded

Theophilus Allen

Ohio County 10th February County Court 1833

It appearing to the Satisfaction of the Court that Theophilus Allen late of this County departed this life more than three months since and no will having been proved and no one having applied for letters of administration the Court has ordered that the Sheriff of this County do by him self or his deputy take into his possession all and singular the rights and credit goods and Chattels of the said Theophilus Allen and sell all the property upon a credit of nine months or the law directs and make return to Court in due form

And Obeyance to the within Order I have taken into possession all and singular the rights goods and Credit of the within named Theophilus Allen dec^d and on the 10th day of March 1833 I sold the same to the highest bidder at a credit of nine months at 10% interest and I took the notes pay able to my self or assigns and the purchase money is here with returned as follows Samuel Cropper note for two dollars 18 3/4 cents John Elkhite for five dollars 87 1/2 cents Samuel Williams for five dollars 25 cents Medley Cropper for five dollars 68 3/4 cents William Allen for four hundred dollars 25 cents Levi Allen for two dollars 25 cents Perry Allen for four dollars 68 3/4 cents and Ed. Burdette note for five dollars 67 1/2 cents amounting in the whole to the sum of \$413 18 3/4 cents including commission and also a note of hand against Reuben D. Christian for \$100 is found in his paper 1830 which is all of the Credit that is found by me in his papers from the articles which was sold by me was his household and kitchen furniture his and Mechanic's tools a Schedule of which is herewith filed No 1 as also the notes taken of the purchasers the copy of the same the disposal of your honorable Court
