my children as fast as they become of
age and the other third that will be
my wife's during her natural life shall
be sold at her death and also equally
divided between my children as
above named as witness my hand and
seal this 27th day of March 1858.

- 1st I desire that the money I have on hand be taken to pay my debts as soon as they can be ascertained -
 - 2nd I desire my lands to remain in the possession of Eliza Williams my wife; Alfred Williams my fourth son; Larkin Williams my fifth son; Lero Williams my sixth son; John A. Williams my seventh son;
 - 3rd I desire my Personal Property to remain on the farm, and for the benefit of the family until the death, marriage or removal of Eliza Williams my wife -

4th I desire after the death of my wife that my land be equally divided between my four youngest sons Alfred, Larkin Lero and John A. Williams -

5th I desire after the death of my wife Eliza Williams that my personal property be sold and the proceeds be equally divided between R. K. Williams my first son, Thomas Williams my second son, Evan Williams my third son, Sally Ann Williams my first daughter, Arletia Williams my second daughter, Mary Eliza Williams my third daughter.

6th I also desire my third daughter Mary Eliza Williams to have twenty five Dollars in money -
And lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my sons R. K. Williams and Thomas Williams Executors of this my last Will and Testament - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal, this the 6th day of June in the year A.D. 1857.
