Dear wife I am well and just about starting on board of the Steam boat Paul Bay, and on next Wednesday I expect to land in New Orleans I have nothing, particularly to write to you but I will write immediately from New Orleans and I expect to get home by the 2^d week in May and perhaps some it expected to get sent you something from this place but I cannot find any good cation here but if I should come across any before I start off I will send you a drop for fear I may not live to return home and if I never should I want this letter to show that it is my wish I will that you shall have every thing that I possess in this world and that for your benefit it is my wish that your father would administer on my estate and save all that he can for you my dear wife this I will agree

Dear wife I have sent you a drop for by Mrs Taylor and Mr Taylor Thomas want my share house etc I return I want you to let him have it and get your father look up all of the goods and all of my papers of every description and and you must keep this letter safe and if I never come back hand it to the clerk's office the fact found known if not the fact known at Unionville I am for your wife

Know all men by these presents that I William Phipps of Ohio County Kentucky do hereby make and publish this my last will and testament for the purpose of disposing of my property as hereinafter directed namely to each of my children as well sons as daughters and to my wife and daughter I find and declare the sum of fifty cents to each and to my friend grand daughter Elizabeth Boley Simons Mary Simons Franky Simons and Elizabeth Simons I give and declare all the balance and residue of my estate to it well provided and ordered of my wife and daughter

praying, praying, all my just debts and the fifty
 cents in cash of my children as above
 stated to equally divide between my said
 four grand daughters except as to the
 youngest celebration and to her I give me
 hundred dollar extra that is she is to
 have one hundred dollar more than either
 of the other three as above named and
 for the purpose of carrying into effect
 my intention and wish to hereby man-
 dated my executor herein after named
 to sell all the property and lands so no
 work when I formerly lived that I may
 pay at my death but such debts as
 he shall believe most conducive to the
 interest of said decedent my said grand
 children and that to be paid as the money
 is collected from the sale of the said prop-
 erty and land I hereby require my executor
 to place it in the hands of the guardian
 or guardians of my said grand daughters
 for benefit respectively I do hereby man-
 dated and appoint unto the said my executor
 and request him to act and carry out
 the provisions and intentions of this will
 and direct that the County Court do not
 require security of my said executor hereby
 releasing and absolving all other wills
 heretofore by me made as well void and
 of no effect but do publish this as my last
 will and testament wherein I have named
 let my hand and seal this 33rd day of June
 1841

 every kind lands described I will and
 bequeath to my two brothers David C. and James
 Thomas this is my undivided interest in the
 tract of land we own together and the two
