deed was produced in Court and proved by the
oaths of George Burton Edward L. Burton and
Allen Burton subscribing witnesses thereto and
ordered to be recorded the Executor therein
named refusing to qualify

In the name of God Amen I Cornelius Roach
of the County of Ohio & State of Kentucky being
of sound mind & memory conscious of
the certainty of death & the uncertainty of
life do make this my last will and
testament I give to my wife Elizabeth
what ever part of my estate she may
be proper to retain for her own proper
use for during her life I give the heirs of
Francis Kellys Wife Jeremiah L Kelly
what ever may be here equal proportion
of my estate to Mahala Ann Hoover
& the heirs of his Body I give one
Negro woman named Charity & all
her increase & as much more of my estate
as will make his equal proportion I
give to George H Roach Edmund Roach
Cornelius Roach Eliza D Roach Louisa
B Roach Clifton G Roach & Wm J L
Roach all my estate that is their
equal proportions I reject all other wills
heretofore made by me I charge Edmund
Roach

#310 - or I Charge Mahala Ann Flower and
her heirs for the above named Negroes \$600
witness my hand and seal this 12 day of
Oct 1836

This last will & testament of Cornelius Roach deed
was produced in Court and proved by the oaths of John
P Burks and William Ralph subscribing witnesses thereto
and ordered to be recorded and thereupon motion of
Edmund Roach who took the oath required by law and
with John P Burks Jonathan Hoover William Roach his
security executed bond in the sum of \$10,000 conditioned
as the law directs a certificate is granted him for
obtaining letters of administration of the Estate of
Cornelius Roach died with the will annexed
in due form
