 and my wife Mary Todd the fol-
 lowing property to wit at my death to
 my wife Mary Todd I do will and
 devise to her for her life time my farm upon
 S now inside which at her death shall be
 the property of my adopted son James
 Riley Todd Also another farm of 257
 acres adjoining the widow Shrieves and
 Isaac Dehaven land to be at her disposition
 whenever she may think proper and for
 her own benefit Also my two Negroes
 Edson and Caesar to her for her life time
 Then to be the property of my adopted
 son James Riley Todd And also all
 of my personal and perishable property
 of all kinds except one red bell gelding
 which I do will and devise unto my said
 cousin Todd Walter to her for her life time Then
 to be the property of my adopted son
 James Riley Todd Whereof I have in
 the name of Almighty God set my
 hand and affixed my Seal

 On motion of James H Todd who filed the
 oath required by law and with Francis D
 Robertson and John H. Lister as sureties
 executed bond to the court in the penalty of
 \$2500 or conditions according to law a res-
 tigation is granted him obtaining letters of ad-
 ministration of the estate of Wm Todd deceased
 with the said annex and it is ordered that
 he have in it next court to him with security

130 This county court Sat Sept 6th 1832
The last will and testament of Cornelius Westfield
decd was produced in court proved by the
witnesses of J. V. Ford and E. D. Smith subscribing
witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded
which is done and thereupon on motion
of J. B. Stevens who took the oath required
by law and with J. B. Kennell and James
Bridel his securities entered a bond in the
penalty of \$200 conditioned according to
law a certificate is granted him for obtaining
letters of Administration with the will annexed
of the estate of C. Westfield decd in due form

In the name of God amen I William D.
Leach man in good health and sound mind
but believing that this appointed for all men
to die and after death to judgment go in
the first place I recommend my body to be
decently buried and my soul to Almighty
God who gave it And as regards the realty
estate which it pleased God to bestow on me
I dispose of it in the following words
I have therefore given to my Son Joseph
Leach and John Leach their full proportion
except one acre each which I hereby will
that I give & bequeath to my son Nathaniel
and William Leach heirs the tract of land
on which I now live containing 349 acres
divided as followeth beginning on a white
Oak standing on a ridge on the South
Side of the finger road fork of muddy
running thence South through my plan

131 Taken to my South boundary line I give to my
Son Nathaniel the east side of said division
line as run by Stephen Shaler and the
west side to William to whom I also will
a hay quantity well called Bayberry
One acre on each side and one acre on each
side and permission and bequeath to
to common running down to my son Nat-
haniel I also give a cow and calf and
pigs and bed and permission to having bought
received a horse back me I give and bequeath
and my daughter after she married to have
one and calf one and pigs one and land
and bed and permission that I give me to have
and my son daughter down there and
that I will give and calf one quantity well
called a pig one bed and permission that
I give her and land and then I will
lay out the bottom of my land in my
will to my daughter Mary Leach
Leach Mary the Eldest Leach the wife
of James Leach to be equally divided
between them and having appointed my sons
Joseph Leach and John Leach executors
of this my last will In witness whereof
I have set my hand and seal this 4th
of October 1834
