 State of Kentucky being much afflicted
 and weak in body, best friend in mind
 and memory do make this my last
 Will and Testament and do bequeath
 my farm with all its appurtenances
 to my wife Nancy Mardin and
 also stock of every description
 Farming utensils, household and
 kitchen furniture, I leave in possession
 of my said wife during her life
 or until our youngest child be
 twenty months and upwards of age
 I also wish my negro woman
 Belinda to stay on my farm and
 to be under the control of my wife
 I wish my wife to pay from the
 proceeds of the farm to John
 Burk, fifty Dollars on the first
 day of May 1858 and the same
 amount on the 1st day of May 1859
 & 1858 amounting in the whole to
 One hundred and fifty Dollars
 It is my wish after the death
 of my wife that all the
 property belonging to the Estate
 be equally divided between my
 four children, should they all
 be living if not I wish an equal
 Division among those who may
 be living
 In Testimony whereof I hereunto
 subscribed my name the 1st
 day of May 1858
 Signed sealed and delivered
 in the presence of David B. Mardin

I David B Mardin on the day
and year above written do wish
it distinctly understood that in
case my wife Nancy Mardin
dies before our youngest child
becomes 21 years of age that my
Negro woman "Blinda" is to remain
with our children until the
youngest becomes 21 years of age
and is not to be sold or hired out
and this I sign and acknowledge as
a part of my last Will in the

Hundred Dollars

Second The remainder of my Estate
of all descriptions I leave to be
equally divided between my Son
William J. Edson my daughter
Maria Ann Taylor and my grand
son Thomas William Edson

I hereby nominate and appoint
my son William J. Edson my sole
Executor and request that he be
not required to give security to
the Bond, which he enters into
as Executor
August 24th 1833
