 that to be my last will and Testament whi-
 ch I give all persons will respect after
 my death. In the event I should not live
 to return from the service of the united
 States which I am a Volunteer for three
 years or during the war

I give I give to my Daughter Sarah Jane
 Farmer the Tract of Land which lies Farmer
 now lives on containing about fifty seven
 acres to have and hold the same forever -
 with the understanding at her death the
 above described land is to descend to
 the heirs of her body her next husband
 by this will having no legal write to sell
 or convey title thereof. I also give to my
 daughter Sarah Jane Farmer one thousand
 dollars so soon as it can be collected out
 of any moneys which may be due me -
 after all my just debts is paid, which
 is about one hundred dollars.

Second I give to my son Samuel
 the tract of land which Isaac Griffith
 now lives on containing about 66 acres
 and further I give my son Samuel
 five hundred dollars out of any money
 due me so soon as collected.

Second. I give to my Daughter Vic-
 toria Mills John David Robert M. Pannen
 all the remainder of my Estate both person-
 al and mixed to be equally divided -
 among the last three of my children
 named, having fully distributed my
 property among my children as near
 equal as I can taking their situations
 and circumstances in consideration
