

This County Court 2d August Special Term
11th Aug. 1834

This last Will and Testament of John
Ralph Dec^d. Was produced in Court and
duly proved by the oath of John W. Morris
one of the subscribing witnesses who
also made proof of the attestation
of the other subscribing witness John
Kinney which being examined and
approved of by the Court is Ordered to
be recorded.

And thereupon John L. Ralph one of
the Executors named in said will
came into open Court and took the oath
required by law to qualify him as
Executor as aff^d by John Ralph Dec^d.
The will of Decedent by provision
dispensed with security.

I Frederick Martin of this County and State
of Kentucky do hereby make this my last
Will and Testament in manner and form
following that is to say—
It is my will that all my just debts
be paid out of my Estate—

And after the payment of my debt I give
to my wife Rebecca Martin one third
part of my Estate both real and personal
for and during the Term of her natural
life and after her decease I give the same
to my last set of children equally to be
divided among them and to be enjoyed
by them forever—

It is my will that my two youngest
children namely Joseph, Thomas and
Samuel have the use of my land till
Samuel becomes twenty one years of
age and then an equal division between
my last set of children.

It is my will that my family have
the use of all of my property for the
benefit of the family as there is no
more than they need for support
and that they be no sale of the property
and lastly I do hereby constitute and
appoint my friend Thomas Luke to
see that my three youngest children
get the benefit of my land according
to this my last Will and Testament
hereby revoking all other in manner
Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made.

and affixed my seal this 20th day of October
in the year 1834 Frederick Martin (read)

I Joseph Gentry of the County of Ohio
and State of Kentucky do hereby make
my last Will and Testament in manner
and form following, that is to say
I desire that all my just debts be paid
if I should leave any unsettled, together
with all my funeral expenses -
And after the payment of my debts and
funeral expenses, I wish all my property,
both real and personal to be equally divided
between my heirs hereafter named -
I have already given to my grand son
James Gentry just \$200. and I have executed
my last will of this date for five
hundred dollars which when paid
makes his amount seven hundred dollars -
I have given my son Samuel Gentry
property to the amount of five hundred
and 25 dollars and my last will for
the hundred and seventy five dollars
which when paid will make his portion
seven hundred and twenty five dollars -
I have given unto my daughter
Riley Neighbors property amounting
to seven hundred dollars, three
hundred and fifty dollars of which
is for a negro girl named Fyntha
for which girl she holds a deed of
gift of this date which is intended
to secure the property said slave
and her increase to her during her natural
life and at her death to her children
I have given my daughter now
deceased her share out of my Estate
three hundred dollars and I have made
and bequeath unto her heirs viz
