The last will and testament of Aaron Pickens dec^d was produced in Court and proven by the oaths of said Pickens and J. Edw. then & conducted two of the subscribing ^{with the} trustees and thereupon Josias Pickens and Bennett Pickens et al. executors therein named having taken the oath required by Law and with Byron Pickens and Wm. C. Pickens their securities executed Bond in the penalty of \$1000 - conditioned according to Law a Certificate of Probate is granted here.

In the name of God Amen I George Runder of Ohio County and State of Kentucky being of a sound mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do make this my last will and testament. It is my will and wish and desire that my executor hereinafter named do immediately after my death pay off and discharge all my just debts after which it is my will and wish that my executor distribute my estate as is hereafter directed. I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly and her husband Baruch (deceased) notes I hold on said Baruch to the amount of six hundred dollars or more also two hundred dollars in money to my Grand Children the Children of said Baruch's Polly one hundred and fifty dollars each. I give and bequeath to my Grand Son

Elijah G Runder the half section of land I bought of M^cDonald and Pierce of Baltimore lying on the waters of Lewis Creek Ohio County and to my Grand Son Hiram G Runder I give and bequeath one gray mare and one cow calf and yearling also fifty dollars in cash. To my grand sons G M Runder and W B Runder the tract of land I now live on containing one hundred and thirty acres with a reserve of three and a half acres on the west side of the creek and south west corner of said land. To my grand daughter Sally Runder I give and bequeath one hundred and fifty dollars and let it also be understood that I give M B Runder one Bay mare calf also all the grain growing or growing belongs to E G Runder and W B Runder as they worked and made it also I wish my negro boy Daniel to be free at my death and to have ten dollars given him of my money. I therefore manumit said Daniel to be free at my death the three and half acres of land as aforesaid is for the benefit of Robert Runder son as I wrote it for land in the farm. I give to Elijah G Runder. I also wish that there is any small money in the hands of my executor after making the aforesaid distribution it be payable said executor my daughter Polly and all my grand children and affixing and confirming confidentially in my grand son Elijah G Runder of this County. I do hereby nominate and appoint said Elijah G Runder as my sole executor of this my last will and testament and do herein request the County Court of Ohio etc. permit my said executor to qualify under the provisions of this will without being requested to give any security. I am hereby revoke and declare void all

do declare this to be my last will and

And the names of God I Edmund Webb of
Ohio County State of Kentucky proposing a
Sound mind and memory knowing that death
is certain to all men do make this my
last will revoking all former wills made
by me and declaring this my only will
I wish and desire that after my decease

my property may be held and disposed
of as follows, I give and bequeath to my daugh-
ter Nancy D. Webb the sum of three hundred
and fifty dollars which is to be put in the
hands of John G. Hall or some other suitable
person to be applied to & for the support of
Said Nancy D. Webb, I wish and desire that
the said three hundred & fifty dollars be put
out at interest to the best advantage & that
the said interest be applied to clothe & sup-
port her & in case of sickness or other need
the principal also be applied to her benefit
And when her decease if anything of the
three hundred & fifty dollars yet remain it
is to be equally divided between my son
Achilles C. Webb & the two heirs children
of my son Robert C. Webb deceased. And
after paying my lawful debts & expenses of
my burial, doctors bills & other necessary
expenses I wish & desire that all my pro-
perty not disposed of specially by this will
which amounts to nearly three hundred
dollars & interest being in cash notes be
put in the hands of the aforesaid John
G. Hall or other suitable person to be equally
divided between the aforesaid Achilles C. Webb
& the two heirs children of Robt C. Webb deceased
and that Achilles C. Webb be allowed to draw
& receive his share of the said money he may
choose And that the share of the said heirs
children of Robt C. Webb deceased be put at
interest & be kept for them until they arrive
at lawful age to heir the same. In Testimony
