I George Row Son of Ohio County and
State of Kentucky being of sound
mind and disposing memory do
hereby make declare and publish
this as my last Will and
Testament, hereby declaring all
Wills hitherto by me made
fully revoked and to be held
for naught. It is my Will
wish and desire that my Executor
hereinafter named do without
delay pay all my just debts
1st I hereby will and bequeath
to my beloved wife Mary Row
the farm that is the entire tract
of land I now live on in Ohio County
together with all the appurtenances
belonging thereto also all the
farming utensils, household and
kitchen furniture and also 1
Dorset mare, 4 of my best cattle
& all of my hogs, also the sum
of One hundred Dollars in money
to be paid over to her by my
said after named Executor for
her own use and benefit for and
during her natural life, and at
her death I desire and direct
my Executor or Survivors to convey
said land and property to my
son Wm. Row which is in accordance
with an agreement of the same
date - I further will & direct
that my Executor dispose of all
the property I may be possessed
of at my death except what

is above disposed of that together
with all money or money claims
I may have I wish an equal
distribution made between all
my children on their legal heirs
I hereby authorize and empower
my Executor to make a deed to
Wm. J. Row the farm named and
carry into effect the entire pro-
visions of this instrument -

lastly I hereby nominate and appoint
my Son Edmund Row my Executor
and request him to act as such

Article Second - I wish my Contract to
Andrew Baker to furnish him 8000 Stangs
to be fulfilled by my executor -

Article Third - Provided that the above
mentioned property when sold is in-
sufficient to pay all of my just
debts I further empower my executor
to sell my lands or enough of it
to satisfy all legal claims against
me

Article Fourth - To my beloved wife
Hannah Pickerson after the payment
of debts, I will and bequeath all of
my lands to her to have and to
hold during her natural life for
