and memory do make this my last will
and Testament

To wit I give to my son Gerrard B Berryman
my man servant Jefferson by his paying
my daughter Francis nall fifty dollars for
the benefit of her children I give to my son
Thomas A Berryman my man servant
Richard by his paying my daughter
Elvry Taylor the sum of fifty dollars I
give to my son Jerome Cassin Berryman
my man servant Willson by his paying
my daughter Francis nall the sum of
fifty dollars for the benefit of her
children

I give to my daughter Silvey Berryman
my servant girl Martha and Increase if
any of or care my daughter Silvey die
without issue the said servant Martha
with Increase is to go to my daughter
Elvry Taylor

I give to my daughter Elvry Taylor my
servant girl Hester ann that the now
have possession and increase for the benefit
of children

As I have already or formerly given my
Several children namely Elizabeth Harbes
Josias Berryman Margaret nall and
Ann moreman Considerable and valuable
property it is not my intention for them
to hereafter have any of my property
except one dollar each

In Testimony whereof I do hereby set my

hand and fix my seal this first day of
October one thousand Eight hundred and
Thirty eight

At Blackstone Taylor Gerard B Berryman

whereas my son Jerome Cassin Berryman
and my daughter Elvry Berryman has made
a change of servants given them in my last
will to wit Willson that were aloted to my
son Jerome B Berryman is now the property
of Elvry Berryman to dispose of as she sees
cause and girl Martha alotted to Elvry
Berryman is the property of Jerome B
Berryman this change being ratified by
self I have Blackstone Taylor my executor

In testimony whereof I do hereby set my
hand and fix my seal this 1st day
of October 1840

In Testimony of Blackstone Taylor Gerard B Berryman

At a County Court held for Ohio County
on the 7th day of December 1840 this last will
and Testament of Gerard B Berryman deed
was produced in Court and proved by the
oaths of Blackstone Taylor a subscribing
witness thereto who also made oath that
Elizabeth Taylor another subscribing witness
thereto signed the same at the same time
with himself in the presence of the testator
and ordered to be recorded and on the
4th day of January 1841 at a County Court then
held for said County on motion of said Thomas
A Berryman who took the oath required by law
and with John A Taylor & Daniel Stevens Security
executed bond on the sum of \$500
Conditioned according to law a Certificate is
granted him for obtaining letters of administration
of the Estate of Gerard B Berryman deed
in due form
