I Jacob Spleheart of the County of this and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory (for which I thank Almighty God) and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life, and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as has pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath the same in manner following that is to say First - I give and bequeath to my dear wife Esten Spleheart all my home property both real and personal during her natural life and at her death I will and wish dispose of as follows To wit:
Secondly - I give and bequeath to my daughter Julianne Bennett fifty Dollars cash also one feather Bed and furniture -
Thirdly - I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally Thompson fifty Dollars cash -
Fourthly - I give and bequeath to my son Jacob W. Spleheart fifty Dollars cash -
Fifthly - I give and bequeath to my daughter Eliza Spleheart being ten Dollars cash -
Sixthly - I give and bequeath to my son William B. Spleheart Mier (Ann Williams Spleheart) ten Dollars cash -
Seventhly - I give and bequeath to my daughter Emmette Miller Mier ten Dollars cash -
Eighthly - I give and bequeath to my daughter Matilda Miller ten Dollars cash -
Ninthly - I give and bequeath to my son John D. Spleheart being ten Dollars cash -
Tenthly - I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Bennett for the benefit of her and her heirs my black woman Ann and her child (boy) named Joshua -

Now and feather Bed and furniture
for the same.
Eleventhly. I give and bequeath to my
son James Soper Salehearth my black
man named John (Jack) and also all
the real (land) estate I may and shall
own and be seized with (of) at my
death - Provided he the said James
Soper Salehearth at the death of his mother
Ester Salehearth, will well and truly pay
all the legacies named in this my last
will and Testament and also all and
singular each and every piece and particle
of the farming utensils and appurtenances
therunto belonging and appertaining -
Mare Will included. And as for the
house hold and Kitchen furniture (to the
same more or less) after filling all the
above bequests I will, shall be equally
divided between my son James Soper
Salehearth and my daughter Rebecca Bennett
at and after their mothers death Provided
nevertheless the said James Soper Salehearth
is bound on does and will well and truly
support and maintain his father and
mother during their natural lives and
after their death pay all their just
debts and funeral (funeral) expenses - and
give to my son Jacob S. Salehearth his
hire and good feather bed.
And Twelfthly and lastly - I appoint my
dear wife Ester and my son James Soper
Salehearth as my Executors of this my
last will and Testament
