Dollars to equally divided between them
and to my brother John Hinton ten
Dollars and to my sister Lilla Hinton ten
Dollars and to my sister Margaret Hinton
ten dollars and to my sister Rachel Hinton
ten dollars and to my sister Sarah
Anderson ten dollars and to my sister
Elizabeth Alexander ten dollars

Thirdly I will and bequeath to my
brother Henry D Hinton one Morassana
and four acres of land lying in Logan
County also two Hundred acres lying in
Ohio County also all my cash notes mon-
ey and all other property after paying all
my debts and all the debts that I may
make during the balance of my stay
here on earth and I also appoint my brother
Henry D Hinton to be my Executor as
witness my hand and seal this 23 day of
July 1858

what she please with I make this my last
will and testament revoking all other wills
or former wills by me heretofore made

Know all men by these presents
that I Charles Cannon of the County
of Ohio and State of Kentucky, being
sick, and calling to mind the
uncertainty of life and the certainty
of death and being of sound mind
and disposing memory do declare
and make this my last Will and
Testament in the following manner
to wit as follows.

1st I will and bequeath to my
beloved wife all of my estate
both personal and real during
her life or widowhood. should she
marry again I wish her to have
one third of my estate and the
balance to be sold and equally
divided amongst all my children
taking into consideration the two hundred
Dollars which I have already given
my Daughter Martha Ann Roswell
which I now is to be deducted out
of her share, and should my
wife die without marrying again
then I wish my estate all sold and
divided as above stated.

2nd I appoint my wife my exec-
utrix and wish her to settle all
my business. I also request the
County Court to ask of her no
security. I also wish her to support
my children and should any of
them marry before her death
I wish her to give them as much
as will make them equal with
Martha Ann Roswell.
