I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally Addington one dollar. I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Ashby one dollar. I give and bequeath to my son William M. Igleheart one dollar. I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna Southard one dollar. I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret Igleheart all the household and kitchen furniture with the room wheels and reel and their apparatus and the Quaker. I give and bequeath to my son Henry M. Igleheart my farm and all the stock of every kind and all the farming utensils also my big Bible & Rifle gun and he is to provide and take care of me and his mother as long as we live and his sister Margaret as long as she shall live with his mother and as he is now living on the farm it is my wish that he shall cultivate marray and improve all the farm as he may think proper except the lot around the house and the garden
