will and testament

- 1st I give to my son Samuel one dollar
- 2nd I give to my daughter Sally Newcome
one dollar
- 3rd I give to my son Asa also the same
of one dollar
- 4th I give to my son Haratis T Briant
the sum of one dollar
- 5th I give to my son Eli the sum of
one dollar
- 6th and lastly I give to my son William
my plantation and all of my property
both real and personal including my
waggon and gear
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand caused my seal to be Affixed

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This family deed is
the last will & testament of Thomas Briant
who died in Ohio and was proved by the
witnesses named in the foregoing paper and
is now on file in the Court of Ohio County
at the place where the same was made.

Loney of Ohio County and State of Kentucky
Being of a sound mind and disposing
memory but seriously afflicted beyond
the hope of Recovery I proposed to make
my brothering law Robert Brown of Ohio
County and State aforesaid my Executor
and to counsel advise and conduct my
beloved childerew through their infancy
he is to collect all debts due me and
pay all my Just debts my beaceo is
to go in payment of my debts and if not
sufficient to pay the debts then such property
as the said Robert Brown shall think

think best untill all my debts is paid
all the Ballance of my property I wish to be
applied Entirely to the Benefit of my children
in Raising of them and I wish them to be
kept to gether as one family if possible untill
of age

I Adam Barnes a free man of labor of
Ohio County Kentucky do hereby make and
declare this my last will and Testament
first I will and direct that my Executor
hereinafter named do immediately after my
death take unto his possession all my property
of every kind and description and dispose
of it as in his judgement may seem
but with the exception of my grey mare

and her sucking colt one Cow and calf one Bed
Furniture and the Cooking implement I am possessed
of all of which I do hereby give and bequeath to
my wife Molly all the balance and residue of
my property I desire to be immediately disposed
of for the payment of my debts all of which
I desire to be paid with as little delay as
practicable after the payment of which I
desire the residue of my effects to be paid over
to my wife Molly or to any person or persons
she may designate and for the purpose of
Carrying the provisions of this will into Effect
I do nominate and appoint my friend John
McGraw my sole Executor and request that
the Ohio County Court do not require of my
said Executor any security whatever Confiding
in him fully I do hereby invest him with full
power and authority to settle up and so
manage my affairs and property as he may
think best

I hereby revoke and declare void all and
every will by me heretofore made declaring
this my only will
