 debts. It is my Will and desire that my

 may leave that she may enow to keep for
 during her natural life or widowhood, for
 her to live and enjoy for the purpose of raising
 and educating our children and authorize
 her to dispose of any part to the children as
 in her judgment she may think proper So as to
 keep them all near about equal, at the death of my
 said wife it is my Will that the tract of land I now
 live on be equally divided between my four sons
 to be divided equally in value and quality
 nevertheless nothing herein is to be construed
 so as to deprive my said wife Nancy from the
 free use of all said tract of land and from
 during her life or widowhood, I hereby confirm
 this my last Will revoking all others heretofore

by me made. Lastly I hereby nominate and appoint Amos Gibson my sole executor and authorize him to carry into effect the provisions herein above directed with as little delay as possible. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and also seal on this 26th day June 1853

I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna Southard one dollar. I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret Igleheart all the household and kitchen furniture with the room wheels and reel and their apparatus and the Quaker. I give and bequeath to my son Henry M. Igleheart my farm and all the stock of every kind and all the farming utensils also my big Bible & Rifle gun and he is to provide and take care of me and his mother as long as we live and his sister Margaret as long as she shall live with his mother and as he is now living on the farm it is my wish that he shall cultivate marray and improve all the farm as he may think proper except the lot around the house and the garden
