considering the uncertainty of my mortal life
and believing it is one of the duties of man to
do to establish and make this my last will and
testament revoking all other wills by me made
in the manner and form following
I do by my wish and desire that all just debts
and funeral expenses be paid
I give & will and bequeath to my beloved wife
Elizabeth Whittlinghill and black boy named Bob
Cretton during her life or widowhood also two new
saddles and bed and furniture good Cows & Cattle
and as much household & kitchen furniture as
will be sufficient for her use during life and
if said boy die or prove to be unable to support
her my wife my Executor is to keep enough of
my Estate in their hands for the support of my
wife during her life or widowhood and at her de-
cease or marriage the above named black boy and
all other property to be sold and the amount
thereof to be equally divided among my children
I do by my wish & desire that as soon
after my decease as will be convenient for my
executors to sell all the balance of my property
belonging to my Estate lands and all property
of every description whatever that may belong
to my Estate or in credit or otherwise as they
may think for the best and the whole amount
to be equally divided among all my children
for each and to have his just and equal share
in & upon a short my wife ~~and~~ Peter & Mrs. Whittlinghill
to be creditors of my said Estate and security to
be required of them as Executors in testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this 25 day August 1846

in the following Manner I will and direct
that the one half of my said interest in and
to said lands and Slaves be vested in and
remain in the possession my brother David &
for the use and benefit of Brother James and
he alone is to keep and retain the possession
of James and half of said lands and Slaves to
have as he may think it proper to do by pur-
chasing land among the poor around Salem or
his devoted self the whole of his (James)
interest or half of my estate over to him but
in no event his father to have the Control
of his said half of my said estate but by
the Consent of David and Whereas it is re-
minded that Brother James died recently in
the South knowing he is now dead or shall here-
after die without Child or Children then and in
that case it is my will and desire that Brother
David to have and enjoy all the property of
every kind land and Slaves having together
willed or intended to be given to my brother
James to be his and to belong to his David
& and his heirs or assigns forever And I also
and bequeath to my Brother Peter Slaves
the sum of one dollar and no more to my son
then Peter daughter Eleanor I give my good
breast pin and finger ring And bequeath my
Whisk I have bequeath to my hand him
and this 31st day of May in the year of 1746

lowing I do hereby wish and desire that all my
Estate and personal property be given to my son
John and bequeath to my Wife Elizabeth Whittinghill
and Black Boy named Shellen during her
life or widowhood and And horse & saddle and
bed and furniture in my Bedchamber and as much more
and as much furniture as will be sufficient for her
use during life and if said Boy die or grow to be
unable to support her my wife my Executors is
to keep enough of my estate in their hands
for the support of my wife during her life or
widowhood and at her decease a marriage portion
named Black Boy and all other property to be
paid and the annual thereof to be equal and
among my children Thus I do it is my wish &
desire that as soon after my decease as will be

enjoined for my Executors to sell all the Real and
 personal property belonging to my Estate lands and
 any property of every description whatever that may
 belong to my Estate as a landed or otherwise
 as they may think for the Best and the best
 advantage to be equitably divided among all my Children
 and for each Child to have his paid and equal
 share as I have appointed my two sons Peter & John
 Whittlespice to be Executors of my said Estate
 and as according to be required of them as Executors
 the testimony whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and seal the 28th day of August 1846
