ch of all persons will respect after
my death. In the event I should not live
to return from the service of the United
States which I am a Volunteer for three
years or during the war

First I Give to my Daughter Sarah Jane
Fenner the Tract of Land which Elias Fenner
now lives on containing about fifty seven
acres, to have and hold the same forever -
with the understanding at her death the
aforesaid land is to descend to
the heirs of her body her nor husband
by this will having no legal wife to see
in convey title thereof. I also give to my
daughter Sarah Jane Fenner one thousand
dollars so soon as it can be collected out
of any moneys which may be due me -
after all my Just debts is paid, which
is about one hundred dollars.

Second I give to my son Samuel
the tract of Land which Isaac Griffith
now lives on containing about 66 acres
and further I give my son Samuel
five hundred dollars out of any money
due me so soon as collected.

Second. I give to my Daughter Vic-
tory A. Mills John David Robert M. Fenner
all the remainder of my Estate both person-
real and mixed to be equally divided -
among the last three of my children
named, having fully distributed my
property among my children as near
equal as I can taking their situations
and circumstances in consideration of

is further my wish and desire that
my friend H. C. Sutton be and he is
appointed my executor to carry this will
into effect having fully devised and dis-
tributed my property.

In witness whereof I have set my hand
and affixed my seal on the 21st day of
November 1861, in the presence of
G. T. Wilson and Jas. Calverton H.
terfield and Wm. C. Kirk. I swear
that this will may return to the
God that sword may return to the
scabbard unstained with blood and that
this once happy land may be soon re-
ited as a land of brothers under our
Common Interest Constitution and
enforcement of the laws and union of
the people.
