one feather bed which he has received I do
also give and bequeath unto my beloved son
Joseph one horse and one saddle one feather
bed five acres which he has received I do also
give and bequeath unto my beloved son Stephen
two horses one saddle one feather bed one
also give and bequeath unto my beloved son
Alfred all that he has received of me and
I do further give and devise unto my son
Alfred the plantation that I now live in
containing one hundred acres with all its
furniture I sold to him the said Alfred
and his heirs forever I do also give and
bequeath in the same manner fifty acres
fallen by warrant to the said Alfred
and I do wish my son Alfred to keep
his mother kindly and support her till her
death And the money above mentioned
to her when then to give part to him the said
Alfred and I also give and bequeath unto
my beloved daughter Elizabeth ten acres in
page one saddle which she has received I also
give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter
Sarah one cow and one bay filly which
she has received and one saddle which she
also has received I also give and bequeath
unto my beloved daughter William one feather

and the ones which she has received
I also give and bequeath unto my beloved
daughters Jincy and Saddle and on further
bed which she has received I also give
and bequeath unto my beloved daughter
Euphrosyne and for the said
I find to see them paid or the value
of them I also give and bequeath unto my
beloved Grand Son. William D. Davis on
further bed and the remainder of his
and for the said I find to deliver
them to him at eighteen years old and
I do appoint my Son Alfred executor
of this my last will and Testament
and I have hereunto set my hand and
Seal this 30th day of April 1827

memory do make order and publish this my
last will and Testament first I commit my real
and body into the hands of my Executors and
Second I have given unto my daughter Sally Westly
one hundred acres of land at one dollar and
fifty cents per acre and also one negro Girl
named Sarah at two hundred dollars and also
one negro man named James at eight hun-
dred dollars and at my death to have named
my daughter Sally Westly to have my negro
boy named Anthony at his valuation and
Third I have given unto my Son Francis Mc-
Cormick five hundred acres land at one
hundred and twenty five dollars and also
four hundred and fifty dollars to purchase
a negro woman and at my death I do
and desire that my Son Francis McCormick
have my negro man named Peter and also
my negro woman named Charity at
their valuation the above named Peter being
the wife of the above named Peter and
further more I will and desire that my Son
Francis McCormick have my negro boy named
Verbaux at eight hundred dollars to have and
to hold the same negro boy Verbaux at my
death it being my will that my son Francis
McCormick have the above named amount
or and also the rest of my legacies and if any
the above named Verbaux and negro boy should
die before the above named Francis McCormick
have taken the above named negro boy Verbaux
his possession then in that case I will and desire that he
the above said Francis McCormick have the value
of the above named negro boy Verbaux out of the
