said county and state do certify that this
last will and testament of codicil annexed
of Robert Kender was at this day in open
Court filed and duly proven by the oaths
of D. G. Kender & Mrs. Thomas as prescribed
by law. being examined and approved by
the court the same is ordered to be re-
corded which is done together with this
certificate in my aforesaid office
Given under my hand this date above

Said will and testament of Lewis Riley
being sound in mind, declare this to be his last will &
testament and declares the following to be the disposition
he wishes to be made of his personal and real estate -
Item 1st I bequeath to my wife Cassandra all my
household and kitchen furniture, one horse or mule
two cows & calves ten large fowls & sheep, a sufficiency
of farming utensils, my servant woman Jane
also a sufficiency of provision for one year, also
the farm on which we now live the above property
she is to hold so long as she continues her on
and a widow, after her death or removal or
marriage, my executor is to sell the same, and
divide equally between B. P. Riley, Wm. H. Riley,
Lewis Riley and Delia Setner. Item 2nd I bequeath
to my son, B. P. Riley, my servant, man Abel to be
valued as I may direct hereafter. Item 3rd I bequeath
to Wm. H. Riley, my son, my servant girl Kadenia
Item 4th I bequeath to my son Lewis Riley, my servant
girl Caroline. Item 5th I bequeath to my daughter
Delia Setner my servant girl Ann. Item 6th I be-
queath to the heirs of my son Elijah B. Riley five
hundred dollars, and I request the County Court
of Ohio to appoint some fit person and take good
security he is to loan said amount one year at a time
with its interest, & take good security of the borrower,
and pay said him as they may, many or come of age,
the balance of my property real and personal I direct
my executor to sell (without any order of court) on
such terms as he may think best at the time, and
retain a sufficiency in his hands to pay the
expenses of a suit with W. Worthington. If
Worthington should get a decree to sell part
of the land my executor is to pay a fair price
for it, & no more. Item 7th At the death. Remond
a marriage of my wife Cassandra my
executor is to sell all the property bequeathed

to her real & personal that may be and divided equally between B. F. Woods, Riley and Delia Lerner and the negroes bequeathed to my four children is to be appraised by 3 disinterested persons to be selected by my executor, and each heir charged with the price set by them, my cash & cash notes is to be loaned out one year at a time, this amount of cash & note and Bank Stock is to be returned in the hands of my executor until the suit is settled with Washington, but to be loaned out until needed. Item 8 I appoint it distinctly understood, after paying the five thousand dollar to the heirs of E. C. Riley or directed, the balance is to be equally divided between B. F. Woods & S. Riley and Delia Lerner. Item 9 I appoint my friend George C. Cogen my executor with full power to carry out this my last will given under my hand & seal in presence of witnesses July 22nd 1860

During the uncertainty of human life and the certainty of death, I make this my last will and Testament. Item first I will that all my just debts be paid. Item second I will a sufficient amount of my estate to build a stone wall with iron railing around the grave of myself family & 33rd Item third I ap. from Wm. C. Cogen & Wm. L. Jones to see that the above work is done according to will. Item fourth I will to Philip Fulkerson my house & 1/2 acre and two hundred acres. Item fifth I will to E. C. Fulkerson the following named slaves, James, Katy, Emily, Sabella & Andy. Item sixth I will my house & lot in Burial with all my goods & chattels to P. C. Fulkerson. Item seventh I appoint P. C. Fulkerson my sole Executor to carry out this my last will and Testament this the 1st day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty one.
