 Negro woman Mary Jane and my
 Negro boy Cassius &c. and my Negro
 girl Mahalada to hold during his life
 then to descend to the heirs of his body
 I do will to said John L. Walker one
 hundred dollars. Item fourth I will
 and bequeath to my Grand daughter Mahala
 Logan Walker my Negro girl Anna
 and I appoint E. L. Walker my only
 executor without security
 It bears my hand this the 6th day of
 December 1859
