William Edson Deceased of this County
and State of Kentucky, being of
sound mind and disposing memory
do hereby make, ordain and publish
this my last Will and Testament
First after the payment of all my
just debts I bequeath to my Son
William J. Edson One Hundred
Dollars and to my daughter Maria
Ann Taylor the like sum of One
Hundred Dollars

Second The remainder of my Estate
of all descriptions I leave to be
equally divided between my Son
William J. Edson my daughter
Maria Ann Taylor and my grand
son Thomas William Edson

I hereby nominate and appoint
my son William J. Edson my sole
Executor and request that he be
not required to give security to
the Bond, which he enters into
as Executor
August 24th 1833

 The last Will and Testament
 of Maria Eider Dec. was produced
 in Court and proven by the oath

In the name of God Amen. I Abraham Bice
 of the County of Ohio and State of Kentucky
 being at this time of sound mind and memory
 And being fully apprised of the Certainty of
 death, and being desirous of disposing of
 what property I may have yet undivided of
 do ordain and establish this my last will
 and Testament hereby revoking setting aside
 and declaring void all Wills by me heretofore
 made.
 It is my Will and desire that after my
 decease my body be buried in a decent
 but plain manner and after the payment of
 my funeral expenses and all my just debts
 that the balance of my personal property
 I give and bequeath to my beloved wife
 Ruth for the use of herself and my two
 youngest children, my Edward and Fuchsia
 I leave with the exception of the land
 and Calk, which is already the property of
 my said beloved wife, and if said land
 and Calk should so be in contemplation of
 law considered my property I will and bequeath
 unto my said wife and Calk to have and
 to hold forever.
 I will and bequeath unto my said beloved
 wife Ruth all my land say the tract of
 land upon which I now live containing by
 estimation about One hundred and fifty
 acres including the farm which she is to
 have and hold during her natural life and
 after her death the whole of said tract
 of land to be equally divided between my
 two said youngest children Edward and Fuchsia
 their heirs and assigns to have and to hold
 forever, together with all the hereunto
 Property which may be left after the
