 in my former will now in the possession
 of Samuel O Peyton I further wish that
 the said will in the possession of
 the 10 Peyton to stand as it now
 does except the case as above given
 under my hand the day and year

 the donor of all things to dispose of it
 agreeable to his own pleasure
 As to my worldly effects which it has
 pleased the Lord to bestow upon me I
 give and bequeath in manner and
 form following viz

Item 1st I give and bequeath to my beloved
 wife Milly Milton my farm with all its
 appertinences stock of all kinds farming
 utensils crop of grain growing and on hand
 household and kitchen furniture during
 her natural life

Item 2nd I will and bequeath to my son William Milton after the death of his mother all the land I own
 Item 3rd I will and bequeath to my children viz John Milton Nancy Lou Sally Taylor Robert Milton Harriet Jones Children to wit Caligann Mary Nell Joseph Frances & Harriet Milton Jones Eliza Dickson & Mary Ellen Rogers all the cash notes I have on hand and at the death of my wife all the personal estate to be sold and equally divided between them

Item 4th I will and bequeath my woman Amey to my wife during her natural life and at the death of my wife she is to live with any of my children that she chooses to stay with
 Item 5th I do hereby constitute and appoint my son William Milton and Byron Dickson my sole executors of this my last will and testament and further do renounce all other wills and testaments As witness my hand and seal this 25 September 1844
