 to sell all the property and lands and no
 track where I formerly lived that I may
 proper at my death and such estate as
 he shall believe most conducive to the
 interest of said devisee my said grand
 children and that to said as the money
 is collected from the sale of the said prop-
 erty and land I hereby require my Executor
 to place it in the hands of the guardian
 or guardians of my said grand children
 for benefit hereof fully I do hereby commit
 and appoint unto the said my Executor
 and request him to act and carry out
 the provisions and intentions of this will
 and direct that the County Court do not
 require security of my said devisee hereby
 bequeathing and bequeathing all other wills
 bequeathed by me make as null void and
 of no effect but do publish this as my last
 will and testament whereof I have been
 let my hand and seal this 23rd day of Jan
 1841

Know all men by these presents that I Sarah
 M. Thomas of Ohio County and State of Ken-
 tucky being of lawful age and sound mind
 and disposing memory and knowing that
 I must soon go that I have from whence
 not having now no lively maker and
 not feeling this my last will and testament
 hereby revoking and declaring void all other
 wills bequeathed by me make first it is my
 will and desire that all my just
 debts and burial expenses be paid as
 soon as practicable and for that purpose
 I give and bequeath to my father, David E.
 a sum of money I had no my brother
 Peter supplanting the amount due to him
 and will to Successors to pay all debts
 I give unto my said brother David & my
 two sons & calves together with all and every
 article of my household goods articles and
 furniture that I may do proper of worth
 my wearing apparel for clothing and of
 which I bequeath to the children of my
 said brother David & and all the best
 and residue of my property and estate of
 every kind land bequeathed I will and
 bequeath to my two brothers David & and James
 Thomas that to my undivided interest in the
 land of land I have also and the two

Shall Mary and Patrick to be divided Equally
between them in equal shares a proportion
in the following manner I will and direct
that the one half of my said interests in and
to said land and House be vested in and
remained in the possession my brother David &
for the use and benefit of Brother James and
he should is to keep and retain the possession
of James one half of said land and House to
keep as he may deem it proper to do by pay-
ing him annually the sum of \$100.00 or at
his decease deliver the whole of his (James)
interest or half of my estate over to him but
in no event his (James) to have the control
of his said half of my said estate but by
the consent of David and wherever it is re-
mained that Brother James died recently in
the South now if he is now dead or should here-
after die without child or children then and in
that case it is my will and desire that Brother
David & have and enjoy all the property of
my said land and House having together
with all or interests to be given to my brother
James to be his and to belong to him David
& and his heirs or assigns forever And I will
and bequeath to my Brother Peter Thomas
the sum of one dollar and no more to my sis-
ter Peter's daughter Eleanor I give my gold
brooch pin and finger ring The following
whereof I have bequeathed to my said son
and this 21st day of May in the year of 1844

of Ohio County and State of Kentucky being in
a bad state of health and of a sound mind entering
the uncertainty of this mortal life and believing it
and appointing unto me to do so establish and make
thine my last will and Testament recording and
other wills by and under the name and form fol-
lowing I have first my wish and desire that all Just
Dues and unpaid expenses be paid unto I have
and bequeath to my Beloved wife Elizabeth Whittington
One Black Boy named Phileas during her
life or widowhood and and have I said and
have and provided her and her heirs and as much more
and I have provided as well be sufficient for her
and during life and if said Boy did or prove to be
unable to support her my wife my Executor is
to keep charge of my estate and her heirs
for the support of my wife during her life or
widowhood and at her decease a marriage the same
named Black Boy and all other property to be
said and the annual thereof to be equally divided
among my children And it is my wish &
desire that as soon after my decease as possible
