

The last will and testament of Solomon Phillips of ^{the} County and State of Kentucky. I Solomon Phillips considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say. First I give and bequeath unto my beloved two sons Solomon W Phillips and Charles W Phillips my farm on which I now live which is to be divided in the following manner Beginning in the Runsey road where it crosses my line and runs W I Blacks thence with said fence to a fence below my barn thence with said fence to a fence while on the Little pipe road thence to A Phillips south corner Charles W Phillips the north side and S W Phillips to have the south side and all other property which may be left after paying my funeral expenses and all my just debts and I give and bequeath unto my two sons above named my two Negroes Lamma and Eliza for which I bind them to support and maintain her and their mother so long as we both may live I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Susannah Phillips all of my house hold furniture and also my Negro girl Lavina for which she is to have the sole custody of and to have pleasure of possession of my horse during her life time and also my Charles horse and buggy for her life time I further bequeath that my two sons above named shall make good to my Daughters to the amount of three hundred dollars and they have one two and three years to pay it in and all over one hundred dollars of my Daughter Elizabeth part is to be paid to my grand son James A Carter when he is twenty one years of age. but if so be that I do not gain the Negroes they are not to pay anything more. And I further bequeath and unto my two youngest sons two hundred acres of land

lying in Hancock County and State of Kentucky. I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Narcissa P Gabbard three hundred dollars to be paid unto my son in three years after his grand mothers death which is to be paid and on or in land until she becomes of age or marries but if so be that she dies before she comes of age it is to be divided equally between the rest of my heirs and third David John W Gabbard is never to receive any thing more than he has already received. I further give and bequeath unto my grand son Solomon Phillips only son of D J Phillips a certain tract or parcel of land lying in Hancock County and being a part of the above named two hundred acres and to be bounded as follows Beginning at a white oak in the Hancock line corner of M Phillips line thence with said line to the Wolford line near the Lyons school house so as not to include the spring near by thence to the beginning to have and to hold forever. And further do declare and appoint the said D J Phillips the sole guardian of the said parcel of land for the benefit of his son. Lastly I do hereby appoint my two sons Charles W Phillips and D J Phillips my sole Administrators of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the sixteenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven

I also will that my son Mathias Phillips is to have no more than he has got

The within instrument consisting of one sheet was now here subscribed by Solomon Phillips the testator in the presence of each of us and was at the same time declared by him to be his last will and testament and at his request signed our names hereto as attesting

I William P Hunt of Ohio County and State of Kentucky do hereby make & make this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made First I desire that my funeral expenses and all of my just debts be paid Second I give to my daughter Adeline Ellis heirs my negrowoman Sarah and her child Filander & further in executors & assignees & Henry Battell & Wm P Hunt for two of my Executors to hire the said Sarah and child out the proceeds or so much of it as will be sufficient to go to the Education & clothing of Helen & Adeline the youngest heirs of the Adeline Ellis

Third I give to Ann Spangler three children and Grand child John W Spangler one dollar George P Spangler one hundred & twenty dollars James Spangler one hundred and twenty dollars Ann Seniors one

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hundred and twenty Dollars and to my old negrowoman Mary one hundred dollars Fourth after the foregoing which is deducted I desire that the remainder of my estate be equally divided between my the eight children and grand children To Mary P Lucas one eighth & to later my Negrowoman Mariab at her valuation Elizabeth P Baskett one eighth & to take my Negrowoman Ann Eliza at her valuation George Harts daughter Hannah C Saeggs one eighth Wm P Hunt one eighth Athalia Smith one eighth and to take my negrowoman Harriet at her valuation if she wants her Linsfield I Hunt one eighth Ansted B Hunt one eighth John W Harts daughter Eliza Ann Hunt one eighth & to take my negrowoman Charlotte at her valuation That my son William is an equal partner in my household Kitchen furniture Stock farming utensils & produce &c it is also my wish that my old negrowoman Bob & Mary may not be parted

Lastly that my friends Henry Battell and Wm P Hunt the executors to this my Will Given under my hand this 28th day of March 1856.
