I William Eidson of the County of Ohio and State of Kentucky do make ordain and constitute this to be my last will and testament Ined; I desire and direct my just debts to be paid and that the same may be done with as little delay as possible. I appoint My wife Maria Eidson executrix and My son William J. Eidson executor of this my last will and do hereby authorize and empower them to sell and convey any property real or personal of which I may

be satisfied at the time of my death or to
 Which I may have title or claim either in
 law or equity upon such terms as they may
 deem most advisable and out of the sum
 I bought of my brother, Edmund Eddow and
 of some of the heirs of my father, to pay
 first such of the heirs of my father as I am
 still owing and the balance to apply to my other
 debts. I do also authorize and empower them to
 convey lands in pursuance of any Contract here-
 tofore made between me and I give the same power
 to either that may qualify and to the Union
 should both qualify. And I do further authorize
 them to settle by Compromise or arbitration
 any difficulty that may arise in the settlement
 of any part of my business.

Secondly: My mills and the lands adjoining and
 attached thereto and all the property tools &
 implements used about the mill also the Carding
 Machine presently to be put up and the wagon
 & team now in use also the Mill and tract of
 land bought of Samual Ellis I do hereby devise
 to my wife Maria Eddow and to my two sons
 Henry C. Eddow and William J. Eddow my
 wife to hold her interest during her life and
 then the whole to go to my said sons and
 their heirs forever. But as this devise is made
 for the purpose of carrying out a verbal
 Contract which has been spoken of with my
 son to make my said son Henry C. to obtain
 the benefit of the devise or to take under it
 he is by deed to release & convey to my executor
 the land on which he now lives and on Rought-
 Creek opposite where he lives to be sold and
 one half the proceeds to go to my son William
 & the other half to the payment of my

debts and if he declines doing this all the pro-
 perty mentioned in this article of my will is
 to go to my wife & son William & upon the
 said terms she holding one half during her
 life and then the whole to go to him & his heirs
 I have heretofore given to my son Henry
 a Negro boy Slave named Daniel and to my
 son William a Negro boy Slave named Peter
 which gifts are hereby confirmed, And to my
 daughter Maria Ann Eddow I give my
 Negro Girl Slave Elizabeth and my Charles
 that my last may disturb my family as little
 as possible I leave it discretionary with my
 executor to sell such my of my household
 and kitchen furniture & property as they think
 proper and reserve such as my wife may
 wish for the use of the family as long as
 they may remain together and when they
 separate for her to give such portions to the
 children respectively as they may need and
 the sum best spare. As to the residue of
 my Slaves my will is that as long as the
 family remain together they shall be kept
 together for the use of the family and that
 when the family separates my wife shall have
 the right to select such of them as she
 may choose for her own use during her life
 and give such to the children as she can
 best spare having due regard to their val-
 ue and the value of those already given
 And at her death I wish the Slaves she
 may retain also divided amongst my children
 my object being to make all my children
 as nearly equal as practicable and to this
 end I bequeath my Grand daughter the child
 of my deceased daughter Susan Webb to have

in place of her mother and to have such portion
as her Mother would be entitled to taking
into Consideration what she has heretofore
received, I wish my executors to consult
my friend John H. McHenry whenever they
deem it necessary or prudent and to be governed
by his advice in making and receiving all said
Money Confirmed in my executors & executor
I wish them to be permitted to qualify without
being required to give Security. In Testimony
that this is my last will I have directed my
friend John H. McHenry to sign my name thereto
which is done by him in my presence this
3 day of April 1847
