The last will and testament of Cornelius Westfield
decd was produced in court proved by the
witnesses of J. V. Ford and E. D. Smith Subscribing
witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded
which is done and thereupon on motion
of J. B. Stevens who took the oath required
by law and with J. B. Kennell and James
Bridel his securities entered a bond in the
penalty of \$200 conditioned according to
law a certificate is granted him for obtaining
letters of Administration with the will annexed
of the estate of C. Westfield decd in due form

In the name of God amen I William D.
Leach man in good health and sound mind
but believing that this appointed for all men
to die and after death to judgment go in
the first place I recommend my body to be
decently buried and my soul to Almighty
God who gave it And as regards the worldly
estate which it pleased God to bestow on me
I dispose of it in the following Manner
I have therefore given to my Son Joseph
Leach and John Leach their full proportion
except one acre each which I hereby will
that I give & bequeath to my son Nathaniel
and William Leach heirs the tract of land
on which I now live containing 349 acres
divided as followeth beginning on a white
Oak standing on a ridge on the South
Side of the finger road fork of muddy
running thence South through my plan

Son Nathaniel the east side of said division
line as run by Stephen Shaler and the
west side to William to whom I also will
a hay quantity well called Bayberry
One acre on each side and one acre on each
side and permission and bequeath to
to common running down to my son Nat-
haniel I also give a cow and calf one and
pig and hog and permission to having bought
received a horse back me I give and bequeath
and my daughter after she marries to have
one and calf one and pig one and hog
one and hog and permission to have bought
and my son Nathaniel receive the same
And I will one and calf one quantity well
called a pig one hog and permission to
to pig one and hog one and hog one
hog well as the bottom of my son
Nathaniel to my daughter Mary Leach
Leach Mary the Eldest Leach the wife
of James Leach to be equally divided
between them and having appointed my sons
Joseph Leach and John Leach executors
of this my last will In witness whereof
I have set my hand and seal this 4th
of October 1834

his heirs the balance of my will to remain
as first written in witness whereof I have
signed with my hand and seal this 26th
day of January 1844.

I do also give and bequeath unto my beloved
son John one horse three acres and calves and
one feather bed which he has received I do
also give and bequeath unto my beloved son
Joseph one horse and one saddle one feather
bed five acres which he has received I do also
give and bequeath unto my beloved son Stephen
two horses one saddle one feather bed one
also give and bequeath unto my beloved son
Alfred all that he has received of me and
I do further give and devise unto my son
Alfred the plantation that I own in
containing one hundred acres with all its
improvements I sold to him the said Alfred
and his heirs forever also give and
bequeath in the same manner fifty acres
fallen by warrant to the said Alfred
and I do wish my son Alfred to keep
his mother kindly and support her till her
death And the money above mentioned
to her when then to give part to him the said
Alfred and I also give and bequeath unto
my beloved daughter Elizabeth ten acres in
page one saddle which she has received I also
give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter
Sarah one cow and one bay filly which
she has received and one saddle which she
also has received I also give and bequeath
unto my beloved daughter William one feather
