the balance of my property to be equally
divided among my children and the heirs of
Samuel McCarty Deceased and the heirs of
Susan Haynes Deceased I wish the heirs of Sam-
uel McCarty Collectively to have an equal
portion with one of my children and the
heirs of Susan Haynes Collectively to
have an equal with the heirs of Samuel
McCarty and I wish my son Charles McCarty

and Justin McCarty and Susan Haynes
Children namely Roda Ann Haynes & Charles
Catherine Haynes and Fielding Haynes and
James Ginter Haynes and Samuel McCarty's
children to wit namely Maria Catharine and
Marvian McCarty and Mary Samuel McCarty
& Melburn McCarty my son & William Wesley
McCarty my son and my son John McCarty
and My Daughter Dmyelak b. Garrett wife

Support of my wife and daughter if needed
for their Support in any way while they
are single

Secondly I will to my beloved wife Mary
Fulkerson and my daughter Margaret
& Fulkerson Permelia A Fulkerson and
Sarah & Fulkerson my farm and property
for their Support so long as they remain
unmarried and live on the farm for them
to rent or lease or manage any way that may
best suit them while they live single and unmar-
ried on the farm and when any of my daugh-
ters marry or leave the farm for them
to take have the beds and bedding
claimed by them and when they all
leave the farm for it to be sold and
the Money equally divided among all

my own grand children Lastly I appoint
John B Fulkerson to take charge of the
Money on hand and the money for my School
and collect my dues and pay my just debts
and should there be any money left in his
hands after paying all expenses for it to
be kept for the Support of my wife and
daughter provided they need it and if any
not for it to go with the land
