make ordain and publish and declare this
to be my last Will and Testament that
to say first after all my lawful debt
and paid and discharged the residue of
my Estate real and personal I give
bequeath and dispose of as follows
First To my beloved wife Susan Stroud
the land and appurtenances situated
thereon known to be the farm on
which I am now living and in the
County of Ohio and State of Ky. To
have and to hold during her natural
life as widowhood. Then to my two
Sons Bradford Stroud and John Samuel
Stroud the land to be equally divided between
them. I give bequeath and devise to
all the rest, residue and remainder of
my real and personal Estate at the
death of my wife Susan Stroud
on the expiration of her widowhood
to my children equally share and
share alike -

Likewise I make constitute and appoint
my Brothers Daniel and John Stroud
to be Executors of this my last Will
and Testament In witness whereof
I have hereunto subscribed my name
and affixed my Seal this eleventh
of May in the year of our Lord
and thousand eight hundred and fifty

First - I give and bequeath to my dear wife Esten Iggleheart all my home property, both real and personal during her natural life and at her death I will and wish dispose of as follows To wit
Secondly - I give and bequeath to my daughter Juliana Bennett fifty Dollars cash also one feather Bed and furniture
Thirdly - I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally Thompson fifty Dollars cash
Fourthly - I give and bequeath to my son Jacob W. Iggleheart fifty Dollars cash
Fifthly - I give and bequeath to my daughter Eliza Iggleheart ten Dollars cash
Sixthly - I give and bequeath to my son William B. Iggleheart (Am) William Iggleheart ten Dollars cash
Seventhly - I give and bequeath to my daughter Jennette Miller ten Dollars cash
Eighthly - I give and bequeath to my daughter Matilda Miller ten Dollars cash
Ninthly - I give and bequeath to my son John D. Iggleheart ten Dollars cash
Tenthly - I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Bennett for the benefit of her and her heirs my black woman Ann and her child (boy) named Joshua -
