

Will

I A. L. Rowe Recognizing the uncertainty of life do this day make my last will and testament revoking all former Wills made by me 1st my burial expenses and all just claims against me shall be paid at the earliest time possible out of my money and other properties outside of my interest in the old home farm if there be enough so also shall a marble to mark my grave be paid for 2nd I bequeath to Etha May Rowe three fourths $\frac{3}{4}$ of my and half my interest in what remains of the old home farm at my death same being three eighths $\frac{3}{8}$ of the whole farm remaining and the remainder of my one half interest in said farm shall go to J. Wilson Rowe and they can hold in partnership or divide as may best suit them but while they remain in Partnership J. Wilson Rowe shall have the power to sell and convey any part or all of the land whenever he thinks it will be to the best interest of himself and Etha May Rowe and he shall pay to Etha May Rowe three eighths of all proceeds from such sales in same way or time he receives such pay 3rd after deducting all expenses as before mentioned I direct what remains of my estate to be divided as follows:

" J. Wilson Rowe 20 " "

" Sally M. Rowe 20 " "

" Etha May Rowe 10 " "

" Mattie E. Rowe 20 " "
