Austin all of my estate both real, personal and mixed after my death to be equally divided between the said five children share and share alike. All of my said children aforesaid being now dead except David J. Austin and it is the intention of this will for my said children to share equally and the share of each to go to the children or heirs of my said children and my grand children.

I then I hereby will and bequeath to my three children viz: Ann M. Austin, Mary Bridges and John D. Austin one dollar each to be paid out of the remainder of my estate. Having heretofore given to and provided for my three children last named in as ample a manner as I deem is just and right. I hereby appoint my son David J. Austin my Executor to carry out this will and hereby request my friend R. D. Moreley to give my said Executor my advice to may need in the discharge of his official duty. 3^d I give to my daughter Nancy B. Black a certain parcel more called blaze and a good middle cow.

And the balance of my property to be equally divided between my above named heirs. I give to the heirs of Susan W. Felix Wirt one dollar.
