I, Charles Huff, being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make and ordain this for my last will and testament.

First, I bequeath to my dear wife, Almarrinda D. Huff, all of my real and personal property of what ever description for her use, support and benefit, free from any restrictions whatever, during the term of her natural life, or the continuance of her widowhood.

The said property consists of all that tract of land on which I now reside, and all the stock, tools, implements, provisions, house-hold and kitchen furniture, beds and bedding, and whatever else there may be thereon.

In the event of her death or remarriage, I will and bequeath all of the above specified property to the three children, heirs of my body, by the said Almarrinda, to wit: Philura, Alice, and Chas Leslie, to be disposed of as they may see fit, when the youngest shall become of age. In the event of the death of either without issue, then

his or her share to go to the survivor or survivors of the three named children. I have heretofore made advances of land and property to my two sons John and Eliza Huff to an extent much greater than I now give the three children above named, and, feeling that I have already dealt more than justly with them, I now bequeath them and each of them the sum of One Dollar to be paid by my Executrix, herein after named.

I will and direct that after the death or remarriage of my wife Almarrinda, my three children Philura, Alice and Chas Leslie shall pay to my daughter Sarah Ann the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars in money, or procure the same to be paid in full of her share of my estate, this on account of my natural love for her and notwithstanding the advances I have heretofore made to her from time to time.

My just indebtedness is very small, and I direct that my Executrix pay all my said just debts out of any money or property that may come into her hands, and that she also pay, or cause to be paid all of the expense of my burial.

I appoint my wife Almarrinda D. Huff my Executrix of this my will, and direct that she be allowed to qualify as such and carry out the bequests herein before mentioned, without bond or surety of any kind.

Having lived at peace with all mankind during the whole of my life, I desire that my memory shall be respected in the same way, by all, and particularly by my children, and I adjure them to abide by the provisions of this instrument.

To all of which I hereunto set my hand, in the presence of Am. D. Ambrose and C. F. Sutton neither of whom have a direct or contingent interest herein, this Eighteenth day of June 1890.
